Prospect residents who do not belong to the Prospect Gun Club may utilize the facility on September 30, October 1, October 7 and October 8. This is for long guns only; pistols will not be permitted. And proof of residency is required; a range officer will be present to monitor all activities.

## Renters' Tax Relief Program for Elderly and Totally Disabled

The filing period for the Renters' Tax Relief Program for the Elderly and Totally Disabled Persons will end on September 15, 2006.

To apply for the Renter's rebate, applicants must meet age and qualifying income limits. He or she must have been 65 years of age by December 31, 2005 or be certified totally and permanently disabled before reaching age 65. All income for 2005 must be documented. The maximum income for single applicants is \$27,700 and the maximum income for married applicants is \$33,900.

Applicants must show proof of all income received for the 2005 calendar year. If you do not file a Federal Income Tax return, just bring all of your year-end statements, and the 2005 Social Security Benefit Statement (Form SSA-1099).

Totally disabled applicants must submit current written proof of their disability and income. Proof of disability can include Social Security, Federal, State or Local government retirement or disability plan, Railroad Retirement Act, or government-related teacher's retirement plan.

All applicants are required to present proof of expenses including rent, electric, gas, and fuel payments for the 2005 calendar year.

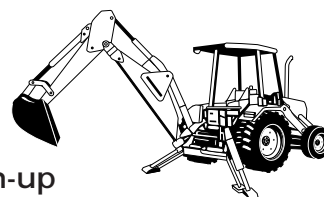
To file an application, the applicant, a relative or an agent must come to the Prospect Assessor's office before the filing period ends on September 15, 2006.
